CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - Please read carefully

- 1. Entries are welcome from all members of the Society and the public.
- 2. Exhibitors may exhibit a **maximum of three exhibits per class**
- 3. Containers will be provided for all entries except classes 20, 21, 22, 28, 29, 30, 31 and Section J (Floral Art).
- 4. Camellia size rings for miniatures/small (70/80mm) will be available in the setup area.
- 5. Exhibitors must stage their own exhibits in accordance with the Steward's directions. Correct naming of Camellias is desirable, but not essential. Help will be available.
- 6. Exhibitors must not touch any exhibits other than their own.
- 7. All exhibits, except Floral Art classes, must be accompanied by a plain white business card showing the exhibitor's name on one side and the camellia name (if possible) and the Class and Section Number on the other. Cards must be displayed with the name of the exhibitor **face down**.
- 8. Any work created or practiced at a workshop prior to exhibition is ineligible for entry.
- 9. Any bloom may be secured inconspicuously to the original foliage by pin or wire.
- 10.All entries except in Section J (Floral Art) and Floral Art class 36 must come from plants which have been grown by the Exhibitor for **at least three months**.
- 11.Camellias will be judged in accordance with the standards of the NSW Camellia Research Society.
- 12.Not Necessarily Distinct (**NND**) means exhibits may be the same or different cultivars). Distinct (**D**) means different cultivars or varieties.
- 13.All Floral Art Exhibits and Spring Flowers (Sections I and J) will be judged by the Rules and Standards of The Royal Horticultural Society of NSW.

SECTION A: CAMELLIA JAPONICA - SINGLE nine petals or less in one row, with a clear central clump of stamens, with or without petaloids.

1. One bloom

SECTION B: CAMELLIA JAPONICA - ELEGANS FORM one or more rows of large outer petals lying flat or undulating. The centre a convex mass of intermingled petaloids and stamens.

2. One bloom

SECTION C: CAMELLIA JAPONICA - SEMI-DOUBLE two or more rows of petals and an uninterrupted cluster of stamens.

- 3. One bloom any colour
- 4. One bloom any colour small-medium *blooms over 70mm but not* exceeding 110mm.
- 5. Three blooms, NND

SECTION D: CAMELLIA JAPONICA (INFORMAL DOUBLE) - any number of petals and petaloids. Stamens may or many not be visible

- 6. One bloom any colour
- 7. One bloom any colour small-medium *blooms over 70mm but not* exceeding 110 mm.
- 8. Three blooms, NND

SECTION E: CAMELLIA JAPONICA (FORMAL DOUBLE) - any number of petals, regularly disposed, tiered or imbricated but no visible stamens.

- 9. One bloom any colour
- 10. One bloom small or medium *blooms over 70mm but not exceeding 10mm*.
- 11. Three blooms, NND

SECTION F: CAMELLIA RETICULATA - includes all hybrids with any *Reticulata parentage.*

- 12. One bloom, any colour
- 13. Three Blooms NND

SECTION G: MINIATURE/SMALL CAMELLIAS - blooms of 70mm diameter or less of camellias registered or recognised as miniatures.

- 14 One bloom, single
- 15. One bloom, semi-double or informal double
- 16. One bloom elegans or formal double
- 17. A single cut of spray

SECTION H: COLLECTIONS

- 18. Collection of three blooms NND
- 19. Five Blooms of Different Camellias
